As believers, we are so familiar with the Christmas story that we <u>overlook</u> what's there The magi showed up some time <u>after</u> Jesus was born

Some scholars think as much as <u>two years</u> after He was born

Jesus was no longer outside in a manger; He was in a <u>house</u>

Not only were these gifts precious, but they were <u>emblematic</u> and <u>prophetic</u>

James Montgomery

"A literary critic would draw special attention to the gifts, for they occur at the end of the story after the child has been found and thus occupy a place of prominence"

Gold: they recognized He was a King Frankincense: a group of priests from afar brought the substance that priests used in the Jewish temple to someone who would fulfill the role of a priest

The Men Who Gave the Gift

Wise men, Greek magoi, where we get the word <u>magi</u>

They were called wise men because they were sought out and <u>consulted</u> about the future

The Men Who Gave the Gift

No Persian could become king unless he met two conditions

He had to master the <u>spiritual</u> <u>disciplines</u> of the magi

The Men Who Gave the Gift

The magi were literally <u>kingmakers</u> of the ancient world

Sixth century BC: King Darius decided to make Zoroastrianism the national religion The magi conveniently converted The magi were literally <u>kingmakers</u> of the ancient world

A mixed bag by the time of the New Testament: monotheistic religion, Jewish system, Zoroastrianism

The magi represented those who were seeking the God of Daniel

The magi were literally <u>kingmakers</u> of the ancient world

Worshiped (see Matthew 2:11) is the Greek word *proskuneó*, a very strong word of devotion and worship typically used of the true God

The Meaning of the Gift

A very particular resin from a very particular



The Meaning of the Gift Frankincense appears in the Bible <u>seventeen</u> times

Almost always associated with the priesthood of Israel

Leviticus 2

Verse 2: it smelled good to God because they did it in obedience and thanksgiving to the Lord Paul had this offering in mind when he wrote Philippians 4:18

One of the roles Jesus would play is that of a <u>High Priest</u>

Jesus is called our Great High Priest <u>eleven</u> times in the book of Hebrews

A priest is somebody who stands and <u>represents</u> people to God Hebrews 4:14-15

After all this, He <u>sat down</u>, which means only one thing: it's done; what He did on the cross was enough to take care of the sins of the world

Jesus sat down to <u>continue</u> His work as intercessor Hebrews 7:25

Jesus is praying for you; He's the one talking to the Father about you Job 9:33

Jesus is that go-between, that Mediator

Jesus is <u>praying</u> for you; He's the one talking to the Father about you Job 9:33 Jesus is that go-between, that Mediator

1 Timothy 2:5

Jesus is the perfect middleman: in reaching God, He can relate, because He is God; in reaching man, He can relate, because He became a man

The theanthropic nature of Christ He finished as <u>sacrificer</u>, but the work of supporter is <u>unfinished</u>

Paul was a good middleman

Philemon 1:18-19 He stood in the gap for a runaway slave Paul was a <u>balcony</u> person

Joyce Landorf Heatherley

balcony people": <u>encourage</u> and <u>cheer</u> you on Basement people: your critics Jesus Christ is the ultimate balcony person; He ascended to the balcony of heaven, where He talks to the Father about us



The heart cry of every person is to make <u>contact</u> with God

You need a <u>bridge</u>, and Jesus Christ is the bridge builder



Priest in Latin is *pontifex*, which literally means *bridge builder*

Heaven's voice is <u>transmitted</u> through the person of the Lord Jesus Christ
