WHAT WE KNOW ABOUT THE WISE MEN

Of all the people in the Christmas story, the group that has the most confusion surrounding it is the wise men

WHAT WE KNOW ABOUT THE WISE MEN

The text says <u>nothing</u> about their number

However many there were, it was enough to make Herod troubled an army or entourage

WHAT WE KNOW ABOUT THE WISE MEN

The text does not say they were kings from the Orient They were spiritual advisors, kingmakers, probably from ancient Persia

WHAT WE KNOW ABOUT THE WISE MEN

They did not come on Christmas night; Jesus was a child when they came

The Wise Men Gave Gifts of Gold

We begin with their gift of gold, the metal of kings

Wise men is the Greek word *magoi*, where we get <u>magi</u>

Wise men appear in the Old Testament in the book of <u>Daniel</u>

The Wise Men Gave Gifts of Gold

Daniel had primed the pump of their ancestors Daniel 2; 9; 12 Many Jews stayed in Babylon and had the Scriptures

The Wise Men Gave Gifts of Gold

The magi had access to all the prophetic Scriptures Numbers 24:17; Isaiah 9:2

<u>Reaction</u> of the Current King (vv. 3-8)

Herod was troubled—Greek *tarassó*, greatly perturbed, highly agitated

Herod was troubled by the word *king*, a word of competition;

Reaction of the Current King (vv. 3-8)

Herod was called the king of the Jews

Herod was not Jewish; he was an Idumean

Reaction of the Current King (vv. 3-8)

He took over Judea after his father, Antipater, died Herod killed any possible rivals He later attempted to kill Jesus Himself

<u>Adoration</u> for the Competent King (vv. 9-11)

The wise men went into a house and saw Jesus as a child Before they gave their gifts, they gave their hearts

<u>Adoration</u> for the Competent King (vv. 9-11)

They worshipped Him, then they gave their presents to Him

<u>Adoration</u> for the Competent King (vv. 9-11)

Before we give any of our time, our talents, and our treasure, we have to give ourselves, our heart Adoration for the Competent King (vv. 9-11)

Gold is mentioned <u>385</u> times in Scripture, more than any other metal

Adoration for the Competent King (vv. 9-11) Was considered the most precious of all metals, the emblem of wealth and royalty More than any other metal, it was

associated with kings

Adoration for the Competent King (vv. 9-11)

The theme of the gospel of Matthew is that Jesus Christ is the King Church historian Tertullian believed that the gifts of the wise men fulfilled Isaiah 60:5

Adoration for the Competent King (vv. 9-11)

We <u>worship</u> the Lord because He is King

In the New Testament

The kingdom of heaven is mentioned seventy times and the kingdom of God thirty-two times 100 times the idea of a kingdom and a King associated with Jesus is mentioned

In the New Testament

We should be worshiping Him not just as our Savior, but our King, our Sovereign

Do you worship Him as your King? Are you His subject, His servant? Is He on the throne, or are you on the throne?

Matthew 6:10; Luke 11:2

Final Thoughts Points to Ponder Jesus paid for you; He bought you; He owns you Are you like Herod, the religious leaders, or the magi?

Herod followed the star of <u>self</u>, though he claimed to be a worshiper

The religious leaders followed the star of <u>religion</u>; they knew all the right answers but had all the wrong actions

The magi were looking for a King, and when they found that King, they worshiped Him Verse 12

Whenever Jesus becomes your King, you will go out <u>differently</u> than how you came in 2 Corinthians 5:17

Final Thoughts Points to Ponder Is He really King? Does He have the authority in your marriage, work life, thought life? **Revelation 4:10**

Final Thoughts Points to Ponder Why wait? Let's cast any kind of rulership or ownership we're holding onto down before His throne
