

How to follow Jesus without becoming religious-John 7:14-24

Jesus clashed with religious leaders more than any other group of people. He went against their spiritual grain and challenged their legalistic ideas. Christ made it clear that He hadn't come to establish a new religion but rather to show the way to God His Father.

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He didn't give people another "system of beliefs and practices"; instead He said that He Himself was the way, truth, and life. In this public confrontation, we learn how to follow Christ in truth and not be religious

I. Doctrine is **Essential** (vv. 14-16)

Jesus is a Teacher

Teaches doctrine (didasko - instruct, teach; didache - doctrine)

Jesus said to teach 36 times in the Gospels.

Jesus called Teacher <u>47</u> times. (didaskalos - teacher)

"Doctrine" is mentioned 33 times in the New Testament

Doctrine is important

Hosea 4:6; Acts 2:42; 1 Timothy 4:1

When truth is sidelined, it's often replaced by religion.

II. Discernment is Crucial (vv. 17-18, 24)

Evaluate what you hear; a spiritual man makes judgments about everything

1 Corinthians 2:15

Discernment is necessary; False prophets will come to you in sheep's clothing Matthew 7:15

Two requirements for having a discerning spirit

- 1. Willing mind
- 2. Worshipful heart

"95% of knowing the will of God consists in being willing to do it before you know what it is" – Donald Grey Barnhouse

III. Religion Can be Harmful (vv. 19-24)

1. It Justifies Evil

The Pharisees and Sadducees prided themselves on keeping the Law, but they were willing to kill Jesus in the name of religion

Crusades- Christians killed in the name of religion

September 11, 2001- radical Islam destroy Americans in the name of religion

2. It Minimizes Good

We have just *enough* religion to *make us hate*, but not *enough to make us* love one another,"

Jonathan Swift.

How to follow Jesus without becoming religious to follow Jesus without becoming IV. A Comparison of Religion to the Gospel

- 1. Religion emphasizes the <u>outward</u>; the gospel emphasizes the <u>inward</u>– Matthew 6:5-13
- 2. Religion emphasizes <u>prohibition</u>; the gospel emphasizes <u>freedom</u> John 8:32

- 3. Religion sets <u>up barriers</u>; the gospel <u>breaks</u> barriers <u>down</u> Galatians 3:28; Colossians 3:11; Matthew 11:38
 - 4. Religion says, "Work your way"; Jesus says, "I am the way" John 14:6
