I. The Events of the Passion Week

$\frac{1}{2}$ of the book of John is devoted to Jesus' last week

 $\frac{2}{5}$ of Matthew devoted to it $\frac{3}{5}$ of Mark $\frac{1}{3}$ of Luke

I. The Events of the Passion Week

From all gospels: four chapters cover first <u>30</u> years of Jesus' life

85 chapters deal with last 3 ½ years of His life Of those, 29 focus on the last week

II. What We Know About Donkeys

Average lifespan 25-40 (up to 60) years <u>George Washington</u> owned the first donkeys in America; became a donkey breeder Favorite pastime: rolling in dirt

II. What We Know About Donkeys

Long ears: enable hearing and keep them cool Not only transport burdens and people, in some areas are used as guard animals According to the London Times, more people are killed annually by donkeys than die in airplane crashes

One of <u>three</u> mandatory feasts Celebrated the deliverance of Israel from Egypt Focal point of their history

IV. Passover scene

256,000 lambs slain; 10 people for every lamb; approximately 2.7 million people Thousands of people meet him and shout "Hosanna!" Save Now! "Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord!" Psalm 118:26: a Messianic victory song

V. Jesus: the most <u>compelling</u> figure in history "I know men and I tell you that Jesus Christ is no mere man. Between Him and every other person in the world there is no possible term of comparison. Alexander, Caesar, Charlemagne, and I have founded empires.

But on what did we rest the creation of our genius? Upon force. Jesus Christ founded His Empire upon love; and at this hour millions of men would die for Him." –Napoleon Bonaparte

VI. Scripture is More <u>Reliable</u> than Opinion Has a demon and is crazy (John 10:20) From Galilee, couldn't be Christ (John 7:41) Three times John recorded there was a division because of Jesus (John 7:43; 9:16; 10:19) What Scripture declares Jesus to be is more important than what anyone believes Him to be VII. Accuracy of prophecy

Luke 19:41-44 Daniel 9:25-26

Artaxerxes Longimanus commanded to restore Jerusalem on March 14, 445 B.C.

VII. Accuracy of prophecy

Sir Robert Anderson in his book The Coming Prince determined: 483 years, based on the 360day calendar year was 173,880 days. April 6, 32 A.D. (the 10th of Nisan) Opinion doesn't matter unless it is as accurate as the Bible

VII. Accuracy of prophecy

Scripture that reveals God with pinpoint accuracy is more reliable than anyone's opinion A God this detailed, accurate, and caring: is He trustworthy?

VIII. Following is More <u>Important</u> than Observation

Followers:

Disciples –followers, learners (v. 16) Eyewitnesses to Lazarus' resurrection (v. 17) VIII. Following is More <u>Important</u> than Observation

Followers:

Those who heard the eyewitness testimony (v.18)

Pharisees-the religious elite (v. 19) Only the disciples believed the Scripture and placed their trust in Jesus
