

The Leaning Tower of Pisa Unstable Foundation A building is only as good as its foundation

1. Who was Peter?

His birth-name was Simon, meaning one who hears

Fisherman

He had a brother, Andrew

1. Who was Peter?

His father was named John or Jonas
His Hebrew name was Simon bar Jonah
Peter was married
He was a leader among the 12

II. Peter was a disciple

Jesus described discipleship very <u>narrowly</u> (see Luke 9:23)

We will never experience the thrill of God working through us until we have the experience of God working in us

A lifelong process of conformity to His will

II. Peter was a disciple

He was impulsive, impetuous, and <u>strong-willed</u> He was <u>self-confident</u> (see John 13:37)

He was prideful (see Mark 10:28 and John 13:8)

II. Peter was a disciple

He struggled with <u>legalism</u> and hypocrisy (see Galatians 2)

He was so human that we all relate to him

He was tenderhearted (see Matthew 17:4)

They crucified him up-side down

An apostle

First there was a <u>name</u> change (then a <u>status</u> change, then a <u>heart</u> change)

Jesus looked at him and renamed him Rocky he saw both who he was and who he would become (see John 1:40-42 and 1 Samuel 16:7)

He was often referred to as Simon even though his name was changed

He was changed from a disciple to an apostle Apostle speaks of an expedition that would go out and represent a king or kingdom

Disciples would be changed from disciples to apostles (see Matthew 10)

The Bible uses the term apostle in two ways

Very strict sense: refers to the original 12 who followed Jesus—handpicked and personally commissioned—there are no more of them

A <u>secondary</u> sense refers to those who were sent out representatives

Jesus said, "As the Father has sent me, I also send you" (John 20:21)

Three important stages of growth: True conversion, genuine repentance, surrender to Christ

Become a disciple, deny yourself, take up your cross daily and follow Christ

Discover your sphere of influence in which you are sent out to represent Christ

IV.A heart change

Went on to preach at Pentecost (see Acts 2:14-36)

Preached to <u>Cornelius</u> (see Acts 10)

Oversee the growth of the church in Antioch
God is <u>patient</u> with leaders; He is developing

them

IV.A heart change

Peter became the <u>rock</u>
FINAL THOUGHTS

Peter wrote to the scattered believers in Asia Minor; in newly formed churches

The very first time Jesus uses the word *church* (see Matthew 16:15-18)

Jesus built His church on what Peter <u>said</u>, not on Peter

In Greek

Peter = pebble, *petros*

What Peter had just said about Jesus = large, massive stone, *petra*

Paul said, "For no other foundation can anyone lay than that which is laid, which is Jesus Christ" (1 Corinthians 3:11)

One of the great themes of this letter from Peter is suffering

Suffering in the will of God Living victoriously in the midst of hostility

*How to live now as we wait for the coming of Christ

*God's foreknowledge and election

*Our eternal inheritance, holiness, excellent behavior

*How to live now as we wait for the coming of Christ

The Word of God causing growth

*Our responsibility to human government

*The marriage relationship

*Defending the faith
