I. We've been <u>chosen</u> by God previously Elect <u>pilgrims</u>

<u>13</u> different times in the Old Testament,Israel is called the "chosen" or the "elect"

Four truths—the <u>Underpinning</u> of a Rock-Solid Life (v. 2)

You were picked before the foundation of the world

I. We've been <u>chosen</u> by God previously

Ephesians 1:4

⁴ just as He chose us in Him before the foundation of the world, that we should be holy and without blame before Him in love,

Compare God's knowledge to our knowledge Our knowledge <u>Accumulated</u> knowledge Product of <u>tedious</u> learning

Result of <u>long</u> research Augmented by <u>human</u> experience Subject to deterioration

God's knowledge Immediate

<u>Comprehensive</u>

Without deterioration

God never needs to <u>research</u> anything You can never tell Him something that He doesn't already know He never <u>forgets</u>

David was amazed at God's knowledge— His omniscience (see Psalm 139) The comfort: If God knows everything, then He knows the worst about you and He loves you anyway

III. We are growing <u>constantly</u>

God is making you a <u>holy</u> person—not perfect You are becoming an <u>increasingly</u> obedient person

"God loves you the way you are, but He loves you too much to leave you that way" —Leighton Ford

III. We are growing <u>constantly</u>

"You must be holy" (Leviticus 11:44) "Pursue holiness, without which no one can see the Lord" (Hebrews 12:14) An excellent book, "The Pursuit of Holiness" by Jerry Bridges

III. We are growing <u>constantly</u>

How do you know if you're holy? You hate what God hates (sin) You love what God loves (righteousness) When you sin you will have remorse and a desire to change (see Psalm 51)

Faith is the root of holiness Obedience is the fruit of holiness IV. We are <u>blessed</u> increasingly Rejoice! *Chairó* in Greek Peace! *Shalom* in Hebrew

Peter used grace and peace; more significant You can never experience the <u>peace</u> of God until you experience the <u>grace</u> of God
