The <u>first</u> steps of a child are also pretty significant

Stepping Stones of the New Birth I Peter 1:3-5

When we are born again, we take <u>spiritual</u> steps—stepping stones

<u>Hope</u>

Inheritance

<u>Power</u>

I. The new birth is a step toward hope (v. 3)

A better description would be to be born from above; a transformation that occurs on the <u>inside</u>

A step toward <u>hope</u>

I. The new birth is a step toward <u>hope</u> (v. 3)

Peter praises God for His plan in saving people which includes:

A changed life on earth

An inheritance in heaven

Security until we get there

I. The new birth is a step toward hope (v. 3)

Christians have hope; <u>unbelievers</u> don't (see Ephesians 2:12 and 1 Thessalonians 4:13-18)

"Most men lead lives of quiet desperation" —

Henry David Thoreau

I. The new birth is a step toward <u>hope</u> (v. 3)

Jesus walked into Peter's life and said, "Follow me and I will make you fishers of men"

(Matthew 4:19)

At the resurrection of Jesus Christ, Peter's hope was reborn (see 1 Peter 1:3)

Three Evidences of the Resurrection of Jesus Jesus predicted His own death and resurrection before it ever happened

Individual and group <u>eyewitness</u> accounts

The <u>changed</u> lives of the followers of Christ

II.The new birth is a step toward inheritance (v. 4)

It's not just about hope now, it's <u>lasting</u> hope, after we die (see 1 Corinthians 15)

All of these earthly things will be dissolved (see 2 Peter 3:11-14)

Be spiritually-minded people, not materialistic people

II. The new birth is a step toward inheritance (v. 4)

Heaven was not just a destination for Peter, it was his motivation

"To be absent from the body is to be present with the Lord" (2 Corinthians 5:8)

III. The new birth is a step toward power (v. 5)

Kept secure—safeguarded by God God will keep you, but you have to want to be kept (see Jude 24)

You are kept for salvation

IV. Three different ways the New Testament speaks of salvation

Past: You have been saved by <u>faith</u> (see Romans 10:9)

Present: You are being saved right now—sanctification

Future: You will be saved from the very presence of sin

This new birth is your only hope for new life
Jesus said, "You must be born again" (John 3:7)

If you ever want to see heaven, you must be
born again
