The stones He chooses are human beings in relationship to Christ, the cornerstone foundation. We will consider God's siteplan for this construction project today

II.THE HOUSE THAT GOD IS BUILDING TODAY

The Basis: Christ

The <u>cornerstone</u>: the most important part of the building

Jesus Christ should be the <u>foundation</u> for your faith; not just a fine example, or a tradition of people

II.THE HOUSE THAT GOD IS BUILDING TODAY

He is the **chief** cornerstone

It all begins for us when we come to Him; It's what He tells us to do (see Matt. 11:28)

III. The Building: Us

When you come, you become
The word *Christian* means <u>little</u> Christ
You share His life and strength
You are a <u>living</u> stone

III. The Building: Us

Christianity is the only <u>religion</u> where the life of the One we worship becomes our life (See Col. 3:4; 2 Peter 1:3-4)

III. The Building: Us

Peter is speaking of a spiritual house
We are a holy priesthood; we don't go to the temple;
we are the temple;

We have a responsibility to be holy

The Four Sacrifices We Bring to Jesus

Spiritual sacrifice: your body (see Rom. 12:1 A sacrifice of praise (see Heb. 13:15)

Good works: sharing with people is a sacrifice (see Heb. 13:16)

Another sacrifice is when we give <u>financially</u> to God's kingdom, His work (see Phil. 4:18)

The Four Sacrifices We Bring to Jesus

Building people up is a wonderful but messy endeavor

IV. The Blueprints: Scripture

The building is built on what God said in the Old Testament

Through the <u>building</u> commission of heaven
Through the <u>architect</u>: God

Into the hands of the Old Testament prophets

V. Two Builders

Wannabe builders

The Jewish Sanhedrin—the caretakers

They looked at Jesus through the measuring implements of their religion, and they <u>rejected</u> Him

People still reject Him today

V. Two Builders

The real builder: God God has a measuring line God examined Jesus according to the measurements of His own perfection God approved the cornerstone (see Matt. 3:17; 17:5; Luke 3:22; 2 Peter 1:17)
