For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly

The Invisible War 1 Peter 3:18-22

In every war, strategy plays a role. Each side plans and makes movements in accordance to what it learns about the other side's tactics. If information is leaked, a counteroffensive can be launched.

The Invisible War 1 Peter 3:18-22

This can be seen in the grand and most profound war of the universe: *The Invisible War*. In this battle, Satan and his minions wage war against God, His angels, and His people.

The Invisible War 1 Peter 3:18-22

We'll consider it by looking again at one of the most enigmatic texts in the New Testament as we unravel it.

Four Facts about the Invisible War

1. There Is a Coexisting Invisible World (v. 19) In verse 18, Peter speaks of two realms Flesh: the realm of what you see; the real world Spirit: the realm of what you <u>don't see</u>; the *really* real world

Four Facts about the Invisible War 34 out of 66 books of the Bible speak about <u>angelic</u> beings

17 in the Old Testament; *angel* appears <u>103</u> times
17books in the New Testament; *angel* appears <u>165</u> times

The Greek word *angelos* means a <u>messenger</u>, typically speaking of a spirit being

Four Facts about the Invisible War Satan began as an angel

Study Ezekiel 28 (and Isaiah 14)—Satan is called "the anointed cherub who covers" (see v. 14) or guards God did not create Satan as a wicked being—He created something very good with a will of its own, and Satan acted on that will, desiring to usurp God's authority

Four Facts about the Invisible War Luke 10:18 Revelation 12:4 "And I saw Satan fall like lightning from heaven" As many as a third of the angelic host fell in the rebellion with Satan

There Is a Conflict in the Invisible World (vv. 19, 22) There is a group of spirits incarcerated in some prison somewhere Daniel 10 (study vv. 13 and 20) Implies that demons are assigned by Satan to geographical regions In God's book, He reveals what His plans are for the future—Genesis 3:15

There Are <u>Convicts</u> in the Invisible World (v. 20)

"Spirits in prison" (v. 19) Revelation 9:1-2 calls this prison "the bottomless pit," the abyss Greek abussos It's the realm of fallen spirits

There Are <u>Convicts</u> in the Invisible World (v. 20)

Revelation 20:1-3 What did the spirits do to get put here? Jude 6-7 2 Peter 2:4 Incarcerated at the time of Noah

There Are <u>Convicts</u> in the Invisible World (v. 20)

Genesis 6:1-8

Sons of God is the Hebrew term *bene haelohim*, the Old Testament term for angelic beings

These are powerful demons, so much so they need to be incarcerated—but that's the point: God, being all powerful, incarcerated them

There Was <u>Conquest</u> in the Invisible World (v. 22)

Jesus went and preached to the spirits in prison (see v. 19)

Greek *kerusso*, meaning to make a proclamation though not in terms of evangelism Evangelistic preaching is the Greek *euaggelizo*

There Was <u>Conquest</u> in the Invisible World (v. 22)

These spirits in prison, thinking Jesus was finally gone, were soon to be disappointed when the resurrected Christ came and proclaimed victory over them



These demons, incarcerated in the abyss, will one day be released

They will be re-incarcerated again with the devil and all his angels after this time Study Revelation 20:1-3, 7-10

Closing Thoughts

One-third of the angels fell; they are demons and hate you However, two-thirds did not fall Satan and his demons are way outnumbered



Closing Thoughts 1 John 4:4
