

# The perspective of the unbeliever concerning death

This is an evil in all that is done under the sun: that one thing happens to all. Truly the hearts of the sons of men are full of evil; madness is in their hearts while they live, and after that they go to the dead.

vs.4 But for him who is joined to all the living there is hope, for a living dog is better than a dead lion.
For the living know that they will die; But the dead know nothing, And they have no more reward, Death is Greatly Misunderstood (vv. 4-5)

The Bible's perspective on life after death Jesus told a parable about the rich man and Lazarus in Luke 16:19-31 Paul talked about dying as departing to be with Christ which is far better (Phil.1:23) He also said, "For me to live is Christ and to die is gain (Phil.1:21)

So, eat your bread drink your wine joyfully with a merry heart

Solomon didn't always enjoy his meals **Prov.17:1** Better is a dry morsel and quietness therewith than a house full of feasting with strife.

How to have a happy meal at the dinner table \*Don't allow complaining \*Keep the conversation positive

The idea in verse 8 is make every occasion a special occasion because it might be your last time together


# C. Add joy to Your <u>Marriage</u> (v. 9)
