THE DAY

JESUS

RODE A DONKEY



As they approached Jerusalem, at Bethphage and Bethany, near the Mount of Olives, He sent two of His disciples, ² and said to them, "Go into the village opposite you, and immediately as you enter it, you will find a colt tied there, on which no one yet has ever sat; untie it and bring it here. ³ If anyone says to you, 'Why are you doing this?' you say, 'The Lord has need of it'; and immediately he will send it back here."

⁴ They went away and found a colt tied at the door, outside in the street; and they untied it. ⁵ Some of the bystanders were saying to them, "What are you doing, untying the colt?" 6 They spoke to them just as Jesus had told them, and they gave them permission. ⁷ They brought the colt to Jesus and put their coats on it; and He sat on it.

⁸ And many spread their coats in the road, and others *spread* leafy branches which they had cut from the fields. ⁹ Those who went in front and those who followed were shouting:

"Hosanna!
BLESSED IS HE WHO COMES IN THE NAME OF
THE LORD;

10 Blessed is the coming kingdom of our father
David;
Hosanna in the highest!"

A Roman would not see this as a triumphal entry—a soldier had to kill at least 5,000 in order to receive a triumphal entry

The Roman forum has two arches called the triumphal arches; the arch of Titus is still there and you can see the engravings of the fall of Jerusalem in AD 70

That day of Jesus' triumphal entry was more significant than anything the Romans could dream up

Jesus had the disciples get a <u>colt</u> that had never been ridden before

He rode a donkey to reveal His identity

Zechariah 9:9 Prophecy fulfilled
Revelation 19 Jesus rides a horse
Jesus' first coming: peace

Jesus' second coming: judgment and war

The Lord needs it

³ If anyone says to you, 'Why are you doing this?' you say, 'The Lord has need of it'; and immediately he-will send it back here.'

"They spoke to them just as Jesus had commanded" (v. 6)

Jesus is teaching them a lesson

Everything was set up in advance

They would have been encouraged when what Jesus said would happen did happen

Jesus sat on the donkey

In Luke's rendering of this story, Jesus held the nation of Israel accountable to know that particular day (see Luke 19)
