

Leave Her Alone Judas! John 12:1-11 THE POINT OF THE STORY

It's a beautiful thing when the worth of Jesus and the love of his followers match-when the value of his perfections and the intensity of our affections correspond.

And it is not beautiful, but suicidal, when they don't

Leave Her Alone Judas! John 12:1-11

They were celebrating the <u>resurrection</u> of Lazarus from the dead

Vs.1 Jesus, therefore, six days before the
Passover, came to Bethany where Lazarus was, whom Jesus had raised from the dead.
Mary, Martha, and Lazarus hosted a dinner for Jesus

Mary made her lavish presentation.

² So they made Him a supper there, and Martha was serving; but Lazarus was one of those reclining *at the table* with Him.

³ Mary then took a pound of very costly perfume of pure nard, and anointed the feet of Jesus and wiped His feet with her hair; and the house was filled with the fragrance of the perfume

Judas speaks up

4 But Judas Iscariot, one of His disciples, who was intending to betray Him, said, ⁵ "Why was this perfume not sold for three hundred denarii and given to poor *people*?" Two thoughts about the expensive ointment

 It was very <u>expensive</u>
 How <u>suicidal</u> it is when our hearts don't match the worth of Jesus

Judas speaks up

⁶Now he said this, not because he was concerned about the poor, but because he was a thief, and as he had the money box, he used to pilfer what was put into it.

Different Responses to Jesus' Worth

Judas had money on his mind Mary's heart was full of wonder, thankfulness and joy Judas loved money Mary's heart corresponded to the treasure that Jesus is

THE POINT OF THE STORY

How beautiful it is when the hearts of the followers and the worth of Jesus <u>match</u>, how <u>suicidal</u> it is when they don't.

Jesus Gives Three Reasons Why Judas Should Leave Mary Alone
1. Leave her alone, because you are not always

going to <u>have</u> me with you (Vs. 8b)

2. Leave her alone, because the <u>poor</u> you will always have with you (Vs.8a)

3. Leave her alone, so that she may <u>keep</u> this for the day of my burial (Vs.7)

Jesus Gives Three Reasons Why Judas Should Leave Mary Alone

The first reason relates to the value in Jesus

The second reason relates to Judas' sense of the value of money

The third reason relates to whether Mary will be able to keep on <u>treasuring</u> Jesus even when he is being buried. Jesus Gives Three Reasons Why Judas Should Leave Mary Alone

1. Leave her alone, because you are not always going to <u>have</u> me with you (Vs. 8b)

2. Leave her alone, because the <u>poor</u> you will always have with you (Vs.8a)

I Timothy 6:7-10

We brought nothing into the world, and we will take nothing out of the world. If we have food and clothing, with these we will be content. But those who desire to be rich fall into temptation, into a snare, into many senseless and harmless desires that plunge people into ruin and destruction.

For the love of money is the root of all kinds of evils. And by this kind of craving some have wandered away from the faith (O, Judas!) and pierced themselves with many pangs. Jesus Gives Three Reasons Why Judas Should Leave Mary Alone

3. Leave her alone, so that she may <u>keep</u> this for the day of my burial (Vs.7)

POINTS TO PONDER

 If any voice tells you to <u>moderate</u> your love for Jesus, do not listen to them. Let your affections for Jesus be <u>lavish</u> so that they match his worth

2. If any voice tempts you to want to be rich in <u>money</u> do not listen to them

POINTS TO PONDER

3. If any voice tells you that the death of Jesus is anything <u>less</u> than the triumph over death do not listen

John 11:25-27
