Angel's Activity

i. Worship

- ii.Do God's <u>bidding</u> on the earth a.The angels weren't singing, but <u>saying</u> b.Angels <u>limited</u> singing
 - i."When the morning stars sang together, and all the sons of God shouted for joy?" (Job 38:7)

Activity

ii.Four living creatures (Revelation 5) iii.Before the fall and after the curse (as though during the fall they minister without song) iv. We are redeemed; Jesus occupies our hearts, we should sing

Shepherds Occupied It as <u>Seekers</u> (vv. 15-20)

They Left Seeking Christ

1.Shepherds were considered outcasts
a.Ceremonially unclean
b.Bedouins; generally overlooked
c. When God told the message that
His Son the Savior was born,

He tells The Bedouin: His Grace

Shepherds Occupied It as Seekers (vv. 15-20)

A. They Returned Finding Hope

- 1. Jesus occupied a place in their hearts
 - 2. Their example
 - a.Received the word about Christ by faith
 - b.Responded to the word immediately

Shepherds Occupied It as Seekers (vv. 15-20)

Recounted what they saw to people around them

3. Some say they were raising the temple lambs for sacrifice; Looked for the Lamb who takes away the sin of the world
