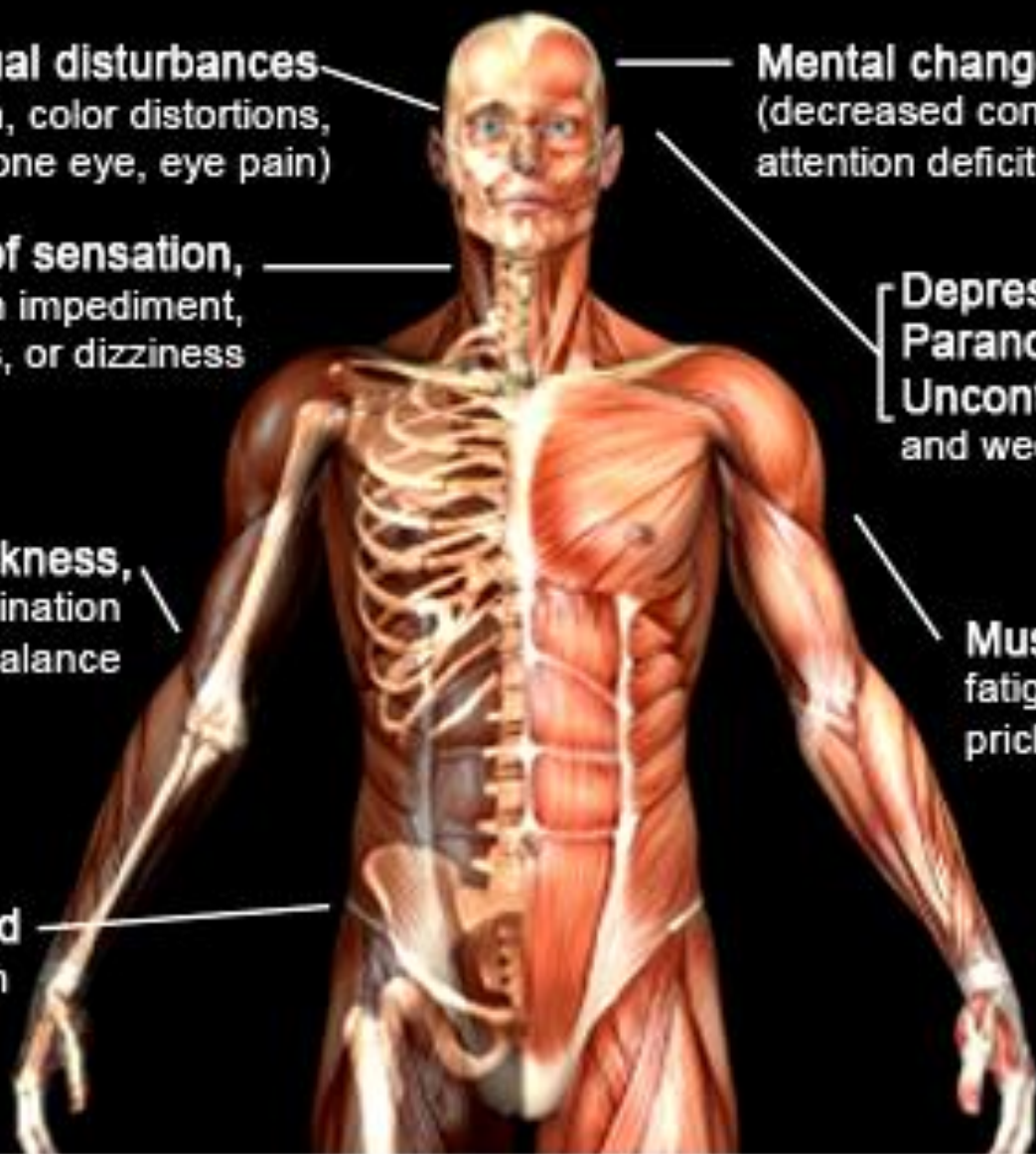

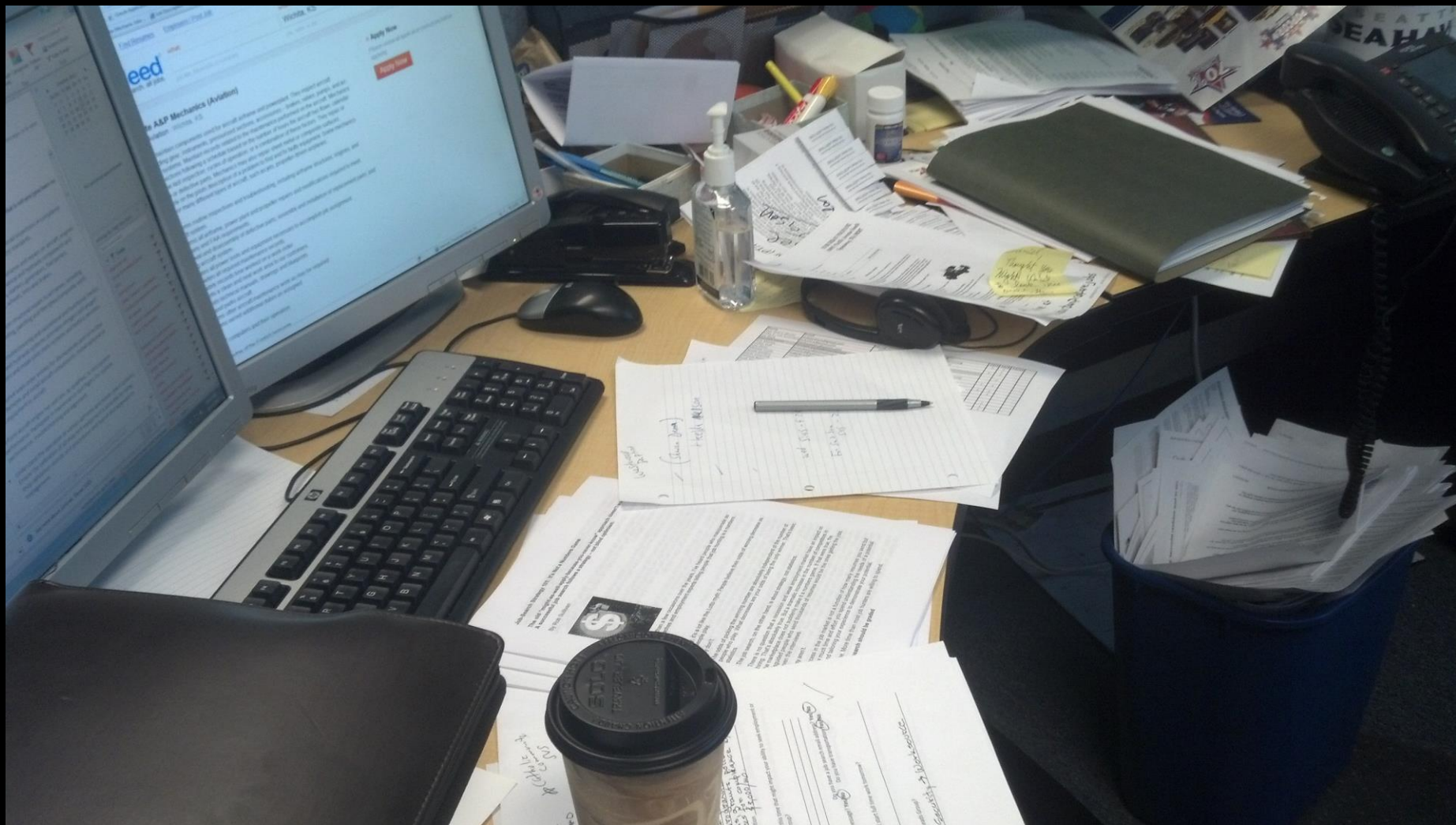

## Keys to successful flea control

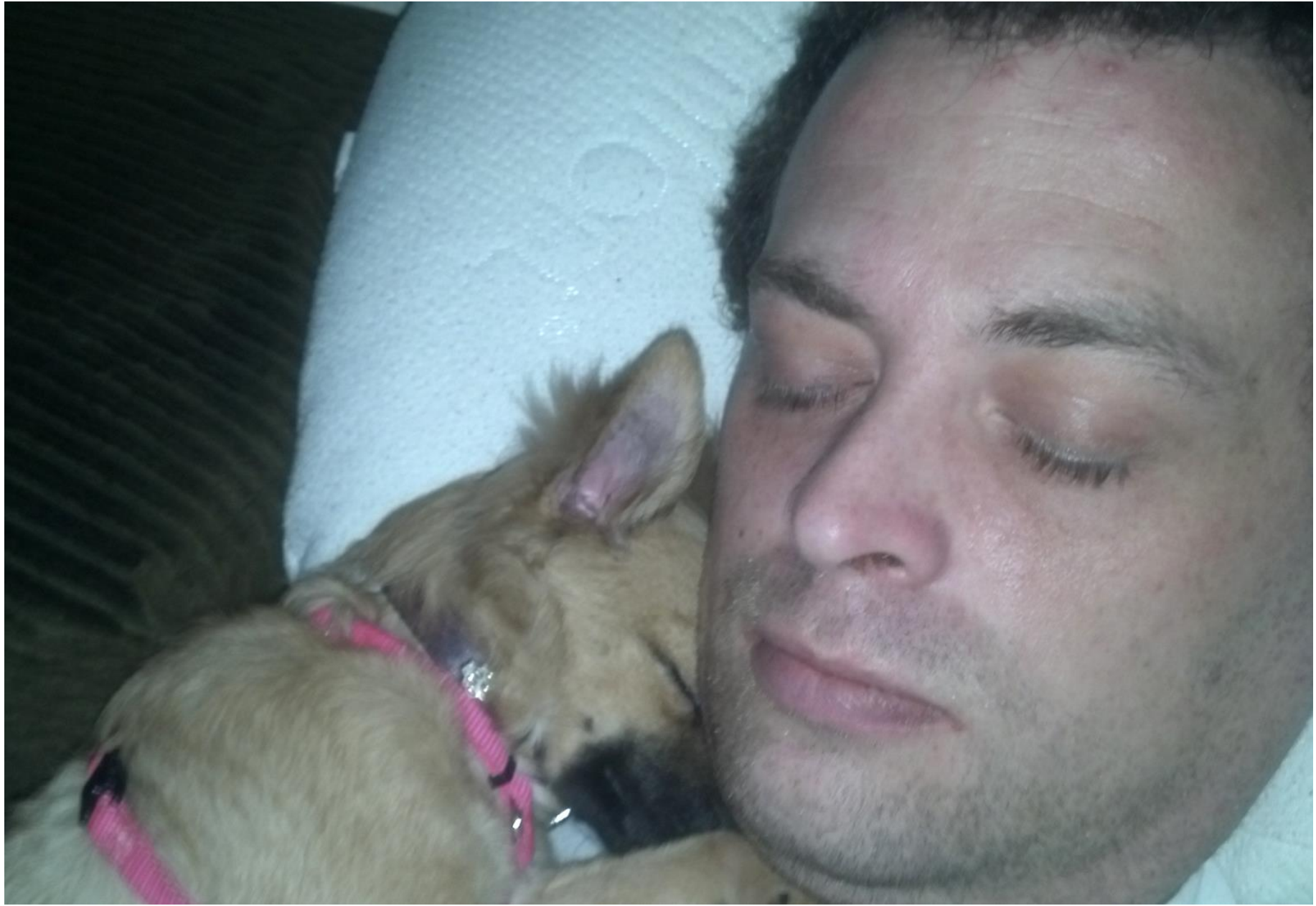
