Daniel 11 is historical

Most of it has already <u>happened</u> It's about <u>wars</u> and oppressors It's history For Daniel they were all yet future

Review of Daniel

Daniel had been reading the prophet Jeremiah It said Israel would be captive for 70 years Daniel prayed Some did return to Israel Only a few returned

Review of Daniel

Daniel prayed and fasted He got an answer, but it wasn't the answer he wanted The chastening of Israel will continue all the way through history

Crop-duster view

Regents of <u>Persia</u> The ruler of <u>Greece</u> Rivals <u>north</u> and south The rogue of <u>Syria</u>

Persia

Angels protecting and ministering God sends angels to those who inherit salvation to serve us (see Hebrews 1:14) 34 books in the Bible mention angels There is conflict between angels and demons that effects what happens on the earth (see Daniel 10)

Persia

There will be three kings followed by a fourth There were more kings The angel is picking out a section of four at a crucial period of time Cambyses, Son of Cyrus Pseudo-Smerdis (he was an imposter) Darius I Hystaspes Xerxes (Ahasuerus)

Xerxes (Ahasuerus)

He's the king who from the book of Esther He was very wealthy He had a huge army He attacked Greece and lost the war 150 years later, Greece took revenge under Alexander the Great

Grecian Empire

Alexander the Great He was one of the most remarkable military leaders In 332 BC he seized the entire Persian Empire Within ten years, he conquered the world Then he wept because there were no more worlds to conquer He died that same night

Grecian Empire

His kingdom was divided Alexander the Great had a half brother who was mentally retarded He had an illegitimate son He had a baby that was born to him after his death All three of them were murdered They divided the kingdom among his top four generals

Grecian Empire

His kingdom was divided

Cassander took Macedonia and Greece Lysimachus to Asia Minor and Thrace Seleucus took Syria and Mesopotamia Ptolemy took Egypt--North Africa and Arabia

Egypt and Syria--rivals north and south

Directly effect Israel Geography in the Bible places <u>Israel</u> right in the middle (see Ezekiel 5:5) Jewish writings like the Mishnah and the Midrash say that the temple in Jerusalem is at the center of the world

Egypt and Syria--rivals north and south

Israel, in the middle, gets the brunt of all their battles King of the North, King of the South refers to not one king but whoever is the king of the dynasty at the time The southern dynasty grew stronger quickly, but eventually the northern kingdom became very strong

Egypt and Syria--rivals north and south

An alliance was made through marriage Glorious land, glorious kingdom--refers to Israel

For hundreds of years, Israel is in the middle getting beat up by these kingdoms until King Antiochus the Fourth Antiochus Epiphanes, a vile person He was an illegitimate king--he seized the throne by flattery He called himself Theos Antiochus Theos Epiphanos; loosely translated means I am god most gloriously manifest The Jews called him Antiochus Epimanes-the mad one Antiochus and warned him--they publicly humiliated him

Antiochus Epiphanes, a vile person

On his way back home, through Jerusalem, he did the abomination of <u>desolation</u> He placed soldiers around the temple area He forbid people to worship He forbid people to sacrifice

Antiochus Epiphanes, a vile person

He sent his soldiers through Jerusalem to kill as many babies as they could findOn another occasion, they killed as many women as they could find

Antiochus Epiphanes, a vile person

He made idolatry mandatory, he erected a statue of Zeus, killed a pig on the altar of sacrifice, forced the Jewish priest to eat pork, sprinkled the juices of the pig all over the temple

He made nudity public

Judas Maccabeus and a group of priests

Those who trust God is a reference to the deliverers who would come-Judas Maccabeus and a group of priests **Drove out Antiochus Epiphanes** Reestablish worship in the temple It is still celebrated today--Hanukah
