A Panoramic View of Prophecy Daniel 7:1-14

The Two Divisions of the Book of Daniel

Chapters 1-6 are a <u>chronological</u> history with some <u>prophecy</u>
Chapters 7-12 are prophetic with some <u>history</u>
In chapter 11 of Daniel, there are <u>135</u>
predictions that have already come true

Some Historical Facts on Daniel

Around the third century AD, Porphyry, a Neoplatonic philosopher wrote 15 books, *Against the Christians* If the book of Daniel is a forgery, it destroys the

credibility of Jesus Christ

Some Historical Facts on Daniel

Jesus calls Daniel a <u>prophet</u>, "When you see the abomination that causes desolation spoken of by Daniel the prophet" (see Matthew 24:15) It destroys the <u>credibility</u> of the whole New Testament

Some Historical Facts on Daniel

Sir Isaac Newton wrote more about Christian apologetics than he wrote about science; he said "Whoever rejects the prophecies of Daniel does as much as if he undermined the Christian religion

Daniel 7:1

"In the first year...Daniel had a dream...I saw in my vision by night...four winds of heaven" 1.Facts from <u>archeology</u>
Belshazzar was scoffed at—said he didn't exist In 1854, cylinder found in Southern Iraq

The name Belshazzar disappeared early from history

Why did Daniel write about Belshazzar when most historians of his time didn't?
2.Facts from paleography—the study of ancient

documents

Old documents point to the <u>Septuagint</u> version of the Bible Written in 275 BC <u>110</u> years earlier than the supposed forger wrote the book of Daniel

3. <u>Dead</u> Sea scroll Fragments of the book of Daniel in Hebrew and Aramaic Written in Aramaic from sixth century BC the kind that Daniel spoke

4.Facts of <u>history</u> are the proof Daniel predicted <u>four</u> mighty nations, and it happened

Robert Jastrow, NASA: "For the scientist who has lived by his faith in the power of reason, the story ends like a bad dream. He has scaled the mountains of ignorance; he is about to conquer the highest peak; as he pulls himself over the final rock, he is greeted by a band of theologians who have been sitting there for centuries."

5.Facts of prophecy defend Daniel It is the verification that God gave us this book of Daniel

What the Bible says will happen, because there is an all-knowing, all-powerful God that says it will

God told <u>Abraham</u> in advance that his descendents would be in a foreign land for 400 years, and that is exactly what happened Genesis 15:13

God told the prophets about the Babylonian captivity, before Babylon ever existed as a world power; and that the captivity will arise 70 years

God told <u>Isaiah</u> the prophet that Babylon would be overthrown by King Cyrus; it was written 200 years before Cyrus was born Isaiah 44:28 and 45:1

"I am God, and there is none like Me, declaring the end from the beginning, and from ancient times things that are not yet done" Isaiah 46:9-10

Only God, at the beginning, can declare the end

That is what we see in Daniel 7-12 Four wild animals; four coming kingdoms The dream that Daniel got <u>corresponded</u> to the dream that Nebuchadnezzar had years before Nebuchadnezzar saw a huge, beautiful statue Daniel saw four wild beasts

Nebuchadnezzar saw it from a worldly perspective Daniel saw it from <u>God's</u> perspective A creature like a lion Symbol of <u>Babylon</u>—winged lion Wings plucked—indicates loss of power humbled by God

Beast like a <u>bear</u> <u>Medo</u>-Persian empire Bear is slower than a lion Bear has brute force Hard to stop a bear

Medo-Persian empire King Xerxes of Persia assembled 2,500,000 troops—moved slowly but with great power Lopsided bear—Persians more powerful than the Medes

Beast like a leopard Incredibly fast Kingdom of Greece Alexander the Great took over the world Known for speed of victory and the speed of the breakup of his kingdom

Iron-toothed beast Iron rule of Rome Corresponds to the iron legs This corresponds to Revelation 13 where John sees "a beast coming out of the sea" Revelation 13:1

Point to Ponder

Through prophecy God <u>authenticates</u> Himself and the <u>validity</u> of His Word
