When was the last time you heard someone respond to an incident or piece of information by saying, "That's shocking!"? Shock (emotional disgust, offense, and aversion) has been diminished due to a widespread exposure to facts and images.

The Danger of Being Spiritually Desensitized to God's Truth and the World's Pain Daniel 8:8-27

Things get too easily relegated to a file in our brains marked, "I've already heard this before." It's a sad day (and dangerous) when we become spiritually desensitized to God's truth and the world's pain.

#### DANIEL'S VISION

Daniel had a vision of the <u>future</u> from God and it <u>shocked</u> him to the core

Four world-governing empires from Daniel's time through the coming of Jesus Christ in the future

In chapter 2, King Nebuchadnezzar saw a statue that represented four kingdoms

#### DANIEL'S VISION

In chapter 7, Daniel saw a vision of four ravenous <u>beasts</u> that represented the same four kingdoms

In chapter 8, Daniel saw a vision of

a goat and a ram

#### DANIEL'S VISION

# God is giving this vision to Daniel for two reasons

Two rulers will come out of the Grecian EmpireThe second one will be really bad in how hetreats the Jewish people and defies GodHe will be a lot like the coming Antichrist in theend days; he is a prototype of the Antichrist

# Tools To Put in Your Interpreting Prophecy Toolbox

1. Verb tense

Sometimes God uses past tense to describe a future event

The coming of Messiah and His suffering Isaiah 53

God is so sure it will happen that it's already done

Prophetic foreshortening

An event or a person becomes a type—a shadow, a picture, or a model of something like it, but in a greater way, later on

# Tools To Put in Your Interpreting Prophecy Toolbox

3. <u>Types</u>

The <u>Passover</u>—a picture of Jesus Christ slain on the cross

In Daniel 8, is a prototype—a Grecian king who came and was a <u>prototype</u> of the Antichrist— Daniel sees this, understands it, and is shocked

#### The vision

Horn speaks of <u>authority</u> and strength A king that is coming A ram comes and conquers the known world From the West comes turbo goat with a notable horn (the first king of the Grecian Empire) The goat defeats the ram

#### The vision

The horn—the king—is broken In its place came four horns One has a little horn that grows up—this is a type of the little horn that will come in the end times (the Antichrist)

Principle: God likes to reveal stuff God reveals Himself and reveals truth to humanity Through creation—general revelation Psalm 19:1 Through the <u>Word</u>—special revelation Psalm 19:7

3 Reasons Why So Many Christians Are Illiterate in Biblical Knowledge

1. Laziness

2. Indifference

3. Don't want to <u>hear</u> it

Only <u>19%</u> of Protestants know that salvation comes through faith alone and is not of works
<u>45%</u> of Protestants can't name the four gospels
Only <u>55%</u> of Protestants know that the golden rule is not one of the Ten Commandments

#### The Interpretation of the Dream

Daniel gets help from <u>heavenly</u> interpreters The large horn was Alexander the Great The horn was broken on June 10, 323 BC when Alexander the Great died What to do with the kingdom? "Give it to the strong"

### The Kingdom Was Divided Among His Four Generals

Cassander took Greece and Macedonia Lysimachus took Asia Minor (modern-day Turkey) and Thrace Ptolemy took Egypt, North Africa, and Arabia Seleucus took Syria and Babylon

# The Small Horn

Antiochus IV Model of the antichrist He tried to completely <u>eradicate</u> the religion of the Jews The desecration lasted 2300 days and Hanukkah ended the desecration Principle: God wants us to know what to do with truth—how to interpret the truth

### Become a Student of the Word

# Be students of the Word and seek to <u>discover</u> its meaning

The study of prophecy should produce <u>four</u> things in us The Study of Prophecy Should Produce <u>Four</u> Things In Us

1. <u>Confidence</u> in God as you study prophecy and see it fulfilled

2. <u>Cleanness</u> of lifestyle—holiness; holy fear or happy anticipation based on your relationship with Him The Study of Prophecy Should Produce <u>Four</u> Things In Us

3. <u>Comfort</u> in sorrow; there is a coming kingdom, a reunion
Jesus said, "Let not your heart be troubled...I will come again" (see John 14:1-3)
4. <u>Conviction</u> for service
