There are 19 Kings [all bad] in the Northern Kingdom and 19 [8 good and 11 bad] in the Southern. As Saul who had no heart for God, David who had a whole heart for God and Solomon who only had half a heart for Him -

these 38 are a mixture of all three. The book of First Kings records the lives of the people of Israel as they lived "In the Eyes of the Lord"[11:6; 14:22; 15:5, 11, 26, 34; 16:7, 19, 25, 30; 21:20, 25, 22:43, 52]. This expression is repeated 14 times in this book. We all need to ponder the theme of this book: Living in The Sight of God

*I Kings 11:6 Solomon did evil in the sight of the Lord, that's bad

*I Kings 14:22 Now Judah did evil in the sight of the Lord, and they provoked Him to jealousy

vs. 23For they also built for themselves high places, *sacred* pillars, and wooden images on every high hill and under every green tree. I Kings 15:5

because David did *what was* right in the eyes of the Lord, and had not turned aside from anything that He commanded him all the days of his life, except in the matter of Uriah the Hittite

¹¹Asa did *what was* right in the eyes of the Lord, as *did* his father David.

2.The Worship that materializes the Spiritual Vs.29And he set up one in Bethel, and the other he put in Dan.

3. The Worship that lowers God's Standards

Vs.31 He made shrines on the high places, and made priests from every class of people, who were not of the sons of Levi.

³³ Even after this, Jeroboam did not change his evil ways, but once more appointed priests for the high places from all sorts of people. Anyone who wanted to become a priest he consecrated for the high places.

So he made offerings on the altar which he had made at Bethel on the fifteenth day of the eighth month, in the month which he had devised in his own heart.
