# Revival at Water Gate NEHEMIAH 8

And all the people gathered as one man at the square which was in front of the Water Gate, and they asked Ezra the scribe to bring the book of the law of Moses which the LORD had given to Israel. <sup>2</sup> Then Ezra the priest brought the law before the assembly of men, women and all who *could* listen with understanding, on the first day of the seventh month.

3 He read from it before the square which was in front of the Water Gate from early morning until midday, in the presence of men and women, those who could understand; and all the people were attentive to the book of the law.

<sup>4</sup> Ezra the scribe stood at a wooden podium which they had made for the purpose. And beside him stood Mattithiah, Shema, Anaiah, Uriah, Hilkiah, and Maaseiah on his right hand; and Pedaiah, Mishael, Malchijah, Hashum, Hashbaddanah, Zechariah and Meshullam on his left hand.

<sup>5</sup> Ezra opened the book in the sight of all the people for he was standing above all the people; and when he opened it, all the people stood up. 6 Then Ezra blessed the LORD the great God. And all the people answered, Amen, Amen!" while lifting up their hands; then they bowed low and worshiped the LORD with their faces to the ground.

<sup>7</sup> Also Jeshua, Bani, Sherebiah, Jamin, Akkub, Shabbethai, Hodiah, Maaseiah, Kelita, Azariah, Jozabad, Hanan, Pelaiah, the Levites, explained the law to the people while the people remained in their place. <sup>8</sup> They read from the book, from the law of God, translating to give the sense so that they understood the reading.

<sup>9</sup> Then Nehemiah, who was the governor, and Ezra the priest *and* scribe, and the Levites who taught the people said to all the people, This day is holy to the LORD your God; do not mourn or weep." For all the people were weeping when they heard the words of the law.

10 Then he said to them, "Go, eat of the fat, drink of the sweet, and send portions to him who has nothing prepared; for this day is holy to our Lord. ### Two Factors That Contribute to a Genuine Revival

- 1. The proclamation of the **Bible**
- 2. There is always the mobilization of God's people

### The Feast of the Booth Leviticus 23:42

The Jews would live in these booths for seven days

The first day would be a day of reading the Scriptures and the next several days would be a day of reminding themselves that God had preserved the people

It was to take place every 7<sup>th</sup> year the first day of the month

### Who was there? Nehemiah 8:1-2

# Ezra the Scribe read the Law of Moses to the People

A scribe had expertise in two areas

He was an expert in the realm of <u>legal</u> matters

He was an expert in the field of <u>Scriptures</u>

He is also called a <u>Priest</u>

### 1. Reading the **Scriptures**

<sup>3</sup> He read from it before the square which was in front of the Water Gate from early morning until midday, in the presence of men and women, those who could understand; and all the people were attentive to the book of the law

- 2. They were attentive to the Book of the Law
- 3. They stood to their feet <sup>4</sup> Ezra the scribe stood at a wooden podium which they had made for the purpose. And beside him stood Mattithiah, Shema, Anaiah, Uriah, Hilkiah, and Maaseiah on his right hand; and Pedaiah, Mishael, Malchijah, Hashum, Hashbaddanah, Zechariah and Meshullam on his left hand.

4. There was <u>praise</u> for the Scriptures
vs<sup>6</sup> Then Ezra blessed the LORD the great God
5. The people responded with an <u>Amen</u>, <u>Amen</u>
6. They lifted up their <u>hands</u>

We Need to Avoid Two Extremes
The extreme of nothing but emotion
The extreme of nothing but teaching

### 7. The Scriptures were explained

<sup>7</sup> Also Jeshua, Bani, Sherebiah, Jamin, Akkub, Shabbethai, Hodiah, Maaseiah, Kelita, Azariah, Jozabad, Hanan, Pelaiah, the Levites, explained the law to the people while the people *remained* in their place.

Vs.8 they read from the book, from the law of God, translating to give the sense so that they understood the reading.

### Amos 8:11-12

Behold, days are coming," declares the Lord God,

"When I will send a famine on the land, Not a famine for bread or a thirst for water, But rather for hearing the words of the Lord.

### Amos 8:11-12

12 "People will stagger from sea to sea

And from the north even to the east;

They will go to and fro to seek the word of the Lord,

But they will not find it.
