# Chapter Twenty Six "It Is Finished" July15, 2012

While Jesus was doing His greatest work, He uttered His greatest words! Through the excruciating pain of a tormenting death, Jesus gave the most meaningful statements worthy of careful consideration. John records three of Jesus' seven statements uttered while on the cross. The sixth—and perhaps the most hopeful—is the one we consider today.

# The Sixth Saying-"It is finished!"

 Not "I'm finished" as if His life is over
 Not "We're finished" as if all He worked for and invested is done

3. Matthew, Mark, and Luke add that when He cried out, he dismissed His Spirit and died
4. Not as a victim, but as a <u>Victor</u>

## The Sixth Saying-"It is finished!"

The Statement is Meaningful

"It is finished" is the translation of the single word in Greek, Telestai
1. Telos means to <u>complete</u>, to bring to an end,

to <u>accomplish</u> or to <u>perfect or pay</u>.

## Historical Use

Used by <u>Servants</u>

Accomplish something asked by the master "I've done everything you told me to do."

## Jesus

On four occasions, Isaiah predicted Jesus as God's ultimate Servant

Servant of the Lord, who accomplishes the tasks of the Master

"For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give His life a ransom for many" (Mark 10:45)
"Did you not know that I must be about My Father's business?" (Luke 2:49)



When animals brought for sacrificeMale lamb without blemish (see Exodus 12:5)Perfect, a suitable lamb for sacrifice

## Jesus, the perfect sacrifice

#### 1 Peter 1:18-19

"You were not redeemed with corruptible things, like silver or gold, from your aimless conduct received by tradition from your fathers, but with the precious blood of Christ, as of a lamb without blemish and without spot"

# Jesus, the perfect sacrifice

His enemies knew He was perfect Sanhedrin hired false witnesses to make false accusations Pilate: "I find no fault in Him" (John 18:38; John 19:4; John 19:6) "I have sinned by betraying innocent blood" (Matthew 27:4)

The Speaker is Purposeful-Jesus lived with a purpose How was it finished in just three and a half years? Did what the Father gave Him to do Evaluated everything in the light of eternity "But seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness" (Matthew 6:33)

The <u>Old Covenant</u> was finished Anticipated the new covenant "Behold, the days are coming, says the Lord, when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and with my people."

"God takes away the first that He might establish the second."(Hebrews 8:6-7) "For the law was given through Moses, but grace and truth came through Jesus Christ" (John 1:17)

The Law points out our faults We haven't kept God's perfect standard Like looking in the mirror Has no power to change you "For whoever shall keep the whole law, and yet stumble in one point, he is guilty of all" (James 2:10)

The Significance is Wonderful Satan's Authority was finished Our Redemption was finished Embrace the new covenant: receive Christ Cannot add to it Cannot improve it Not a joint effort **Believe** in Him

"It's too late for you to do anything; Jesus has already done it all!"—Alexander Wooten "And bowing His head, He gave up His spirit" (John 19:30) He bowed His head, then died He put His head down and dismissed His spirit "No one takes it from Me, but I lay it down of Myself. I have power to lay it down, and I have power to take it again" (John 10:18)

God finishes everything He starts "Looking unto Jesus, the author and finisher of our faith, who for the joy that was set before Him endured the cross" (Hebrews 12:2) Assuredly, I say to you, today you will be with Me in Paradise" Luke 23:43

Although the work is finished, we may have unfinished business
